

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



This manual provides procedures for removing and installing components in your computer. Unless otherwise noted, each procedure assumes that the following conditions exist:

- 1 You have performed the steps in <u>Turning Off Your Computer</u> and <u>Before Working Inside Your Computer</u>.
- 1 You have read the safety information that shipped with your computer.
- 1 A component can be replaced or—if purchased separately—installed by performing the removal procedure in the reverse order.

Recommended Tools

The procedures in this document may require the following tools:

- 1 Small flat-blade screwdriver
- 1 Phillips screwdriver
- 1 Plastic scribe
- 1 BIOS upgrade CD or the BIOS executable update program available on the Dell Support website at support.dell.com

Turning Off Your Computer

A CAUTION: To avoid losing data, save and close all open files and exit all open programs before you turn off your computer.

- 1. Save and close all open files and exit all open programs.
- In Microsoft[®] Windows Vista[®], click Start [®], click the arrow [№], and then click Shut Down.
 The computer turns off after the operating system shutdown process finishes.
- 3. Ensure that the computer and all attached devices are turned off. If your computer and attached devices did not automatically turn off when you shut down your operating system, press and hold the power button until the computer turns off.

Before Working Inside Your Computer

Use the following safety guidelines to help protect your computer from potential damage and to help to ensure your own personal safety.

Flashing the BIOS From a CD

- 1. Ensure that the AC adapter is plugged in and that the main battery is installed properly.
- NOTE: If you use a BIOS-update program CD to flash the BIOS, set up the computer to boot from a CD before inserting the CD.
- 2. Insert the BIOS-update program CD, and restart the computer.
 Follow the procedures that appear on the screen. The computer continues to boot and updates the new BIOS. When the flash update is complete, the computer will automatically restart.
- 3. Press <F2> during POST to enter the system setup program.
- 4. Press <F9> to reset the computer defaults.
- 5. Press <Esc>, select Save changes and reboot, and press <Enter> to save configuration changes.
- 6. Remove the BIOS-update program CD from the drive and restart the computer.

Flashing the BIOS From the Hard Drive

- 1. Ensure that the AC adapter is plugged in, the main battery is properly installed, and a network cable is attached.
- 2. Turn on the computer.
- 3. Locate the latest BIOS update file for your computer at support.dell.com.
- 4. Click Drivers & Downloads→ Select Model.
- 5. Select the type of product in the **Select Your Product Family** list.
- 6. Select the product brand in the Select Your Product Line list.
- 7. Select the product model number in the Select Your Product Model list.
- NOTE: If you have selected a different model and want to start over again, click Start Over on the top right of the menu.
- 8. Click Confirm.
- 9. A list of results appear on the screen. Click BIOS.
- Click **Download Now** to download the latest BIOS file.
 The **File Download** window appears.
- 11. Click Save to save the file on your desktop. The file downloads to your desktop.
- 12. Click Close if the Download Complete window appears.

 The file icon appears on your desktop and is titled the same as the downloaded BIOS update file.
- 13. Double-click the file icon on the desktop and follow the procedures on the screen.





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

CAUTION: To ensure maximum cooling for the processor, do not touch the heat transfer areas on the processor thermal-cooling assembly. The oils in your skin can reduce the heat transfer capability of the thermal pads.

△ CAUTION: When removing the processor module, pull the module straight up. Be careful not to bend the pins on the processor module.

4. Lift the processor module from the ZIF socket.

NOTE: If a new processor is installed, you will receive a new thermal-cooling assembly, which will include an affixed thermal pad, or you will receive a new thermal pad along with documentation to illustrate proper installation.

- 1. Follow the procedures in Before You Begin.
- 2. Align the pin-1 corner of the processor module with the pin-1 corner of the ZIF socket, then insert the processor module.
- MOTE: The pin-1 corner of the processor module has a triangle that aligns with the triangle on the pin-1 corner of the ZIF socket.

When the processor module is properly seated, all four corners are aligned at the same height. If one or more corners of the module are higher than the others, the module is not seated properly.

△ CAUTION: To avoid damage to the processor, hold the screwdriver perpendicular to the processor when turning the cam screw.

- 3. Tighten the ZIF socket by turning the cam screw clockwise to secure the processor module to the system board.
- 4. Replace the processor heat sink (see Replacing the Processor Heat Sink).


