# **Before Working Inside Your Computer**

## **Before You Begin**



CAUTION: To avoid data loss, save and close all open files and exit all open programs before turning off your computer.

- 1 Save and close all open files, exit all open programs, and turn off your computer. Point to the lower or upper-right corner of the screen to open the Charms sidebar and click Settings→ Power→ Shut down.
  - **NOTE:** If you use a different operating system, see the documentation of your operating system for shut-down instructions.
- 2 After the computer shuts down, disconnect it from the electrical outlet.
- 3 Disconnect all cables — such as power and USB cables — from your computer.
- Disconnect all peripherals connected to your computer.














