Manual conventions

When you are instructed to "touch" something, use your finger to touch an item on the screen.

The small arrows (>) used in the text indicate that you should touch a series of items. For example, if you see "touch **Where to** > **Favorites**" you should touch **Where to**, and then touch **Favorites**.

nüvi Tips and shortcuts

- To quickly return to the Menu page, touch and hold **Back**.
- Touch and to see more choices. Touch and hold to scroll faster.

What's in the box?

nüvi GPS device and **vehicle suction cup mount**.

Vehicle power cable to provide external power, or an FM TMC **traffic receiver** to provide external power and traffic information. See the table on the right.

USB cable to connect the nüvi to your computer. Your nüvi connects to your computer as a mass storage device. See pages 25–26.

Dashboard disk to mount the suction cup mount on your dashboard. See page 49.



Check your state and local traffic laws before mounting. Currently, state laws in California and Minnesota prohibit drivers from using suction mounts on their windshields while operating motor vehicles. Other Garmin dashboard or friction mounting options should be used. See page 49.

step 1: Mount the nüvi

- 1. Plug the vehicle power cable into the power connector on the right side of the cradle.
- 2. Snap the cradle onto the suction cup arm.
- clean and dry your windshield and the suction cup with a lint-free cloth. Remove the clear plastic from the suction cup. Place the suction cup on the windshield.
- 4. Flip the lever back, toward the windshield.
- 5. Fit the bottom of your nüvi into the cradle.
- 6. Tilt the nüvi back until it snaps into place.
- Plug the other end of the vehicle power cable into a power outlet in your vehicle. Your unit should turn on automatically if it is plugged in and your vehicle is running.
- If you are using a traffic receiver in Europe, secure the traffic receiver's antenna to the windshield using the

suction cups. (The traffic receiver is included in some nüvi 710, 750T, 760, and 770 packages.)

Step 2: Configure the nüvi

To turn on your nüvi, slide the **OPower** key to the left. Follow the on-screen instructions.

step 3: acquire satellites

Go outdoors to an open area, out of garages, and away from tall buildings. Stop your vehicle, and turn on the nüvi. Acquiring satellite signals may take a few minutes.

The bars indicate GPS satellite strength. When one bar is green, the nüvi has acquired satellite signals. Now you can select a destination and navigate to it. For more information about GPS, see page 50 and visit www.garmin.com/ aboutGPS.



finding your destination

The Where to menu provides several different categories for you to use when searching for addresses, cities, and other locations. The detailed map loaded in your nüvi contains millions of points of interest, such as restaurants, hotels, and auto services.

following your route

As you travel, your nüvi guides you to your destination with voice prompts, arrows on the map, and directions at the top of the map. If you depart from the original route, your nüvi recalculates the route and provides new directions.



Your route is marked with a magenta line. Follow the arrows as you take turns.



A checkered flag marks your destination.

adding a Via Point

You can add a stop (via point) to your route. The nüvi gives you directions to the stop and then to your final destination.



TiP: If you want to add more than one stop to the route, edit the current route. See page 12.

- 1. With a route active, touch Menu > Where to.
- 2. Search for the extra stop.
- 3. touch Go.
- touch add as Via Point to add this stop before your destination. touch set as new destination to make this your new final destination.

Taking a detour

If a road on your route is closed, you can take a detour.

- 1. With a route active, touch Menu.
- 2. touch detour.

The nüvi attempts to get you back on your original route as quickly as possible. If the route you are currently taking is the only reasonable option, the nüvi might not calculate a detour.

stopping the route

- 1. With a route active, touch Menu.
- 2. touch stop.

adjusting the Volume

From the Menu page, touch **Volume**. Touch **1** and **1** to adjust the master volume. Touch **Mute** to mute all audio. To set up the FM transmitter, see pages 35–36.

locking the screen

To prevent accidental screen taps, slide the **Power** key to the right (⊕). To unlock the screen, slide the **Power** key to the center position.

Where To

The **Q** Where to menu provides several different categories you can use to search for locations. To learn how to perform a simple search, see page 5.



TiP: Touch **near** to change the search area. See page 13.

Go Page options

Touch an item in the search results list to view the Go page.



Touch **go** to create a turn-by-turn route to this location.

Touch **Show Map** to view this location on the map. If the GPS mode is off, touch **Set Location** to set your current location here. Touch **Save** to save this location. See page 10.

If a mobile phone with Bluetooth wireless technology is connected, touch to call this location (nüvi 710, 760, and 770 only).

finding an address

- 1. touch Where to > address.
- touch change state/Province, if necessary.
- 3. touch search all .

OR

touch **spell city**, enter the city/postal code, and touch **done**. Select the city/postal code in the list. (not all map data provides postal code searching.)

- 4. Enter the number of the address, and touch **done**.
- 5. Enter the street name, and touch **done**. Select the correct street in the list, if necessary.
- 6. Touch the address, if necessary.

finding a Place by spelling the name

If you know the name of the location you are looking for, you can spell it using the on-screen keyboard. You can also enter letters contained in the name to narrow the search.

- 1. touch Where to > Points of interest > spell name .
- 2. Using the on-screen keyboard, enter letters in the name. touch **done**.

Using the On-Screen Keyboard

When an on-screen keyboard appears, touch a letter or number to enter it.



Touch → to add a space. Touch < and > to move the cursor. Touch < to delete the character. Touch > to select words you have recently typed and selected.

Touch **Mode** to select the keyboard language mode. Touch **123** to enter numbers and special characters.



TiP: You can change the keyboard layout to QWERTY, which is like a standard computer keyboard layout. See page 37.

setting a home location

You can set a home location for the place you return to most often.

- 1. touch Where to > Go home.
- 2. Select an option.

Going Home

After you set your home location, you can route to it at any time by touching **Where to** > **go Home**.

Where to

Changing Your Home Location

To change your home location, you must first delete it from **Favorites**.

- 1. touch Where to > favorites .
- touch home > edit > delete > yes.

After you delete your home location, reset it by following the steps in the "Setting a Home Location" section above.

finding recently found Places

Your nüvi stores the last 50 of your recent finds in the Recently Found list. The most recently viewed places appear at the top of the list. Touch **Where to** > **recently Found** to view your recently found items.

Deleting Recently Found Places

To remove all places from the Recently Found list, touch **Clear** > **Yes**.



noTe: When you touch **Clear**, all items from the list are removed. It does not delete the actual place from your unit.

fa vorites

You can save places in your Favorites, so you can quickly find them and create routes to them. Your home location is also stored in Favorites.

Saving Your Current Location

From the Map page, touch Save Location to save your current location.

Saving Places You Find

- 1. After you have found a place you want to save, touch **save**.
- 2. touch **ok** . the place is saved in **favorites** .

Finding Saved Places

- 1. touch Where to.
- 2. touch **favorites** . your saved locations are listed.



TiP: Your **Last Position** is automatically saved each time you remove the nüvi from the cradle. Use this feature to find your car in a parking lot.

Editing Saved Places

- 1. touch Where to > favorites .
- 2. touch the location you want to edit.
- 3. touch edit.

- 4. Touch a button to edit the location:
 - change name —enter a new name, and touch done.
 - change Map symbol —touch a new symbol.

Where to

creating and Taking routes

Touch Where to > routes. Select the route you want to take and touch go.

Creating a Saved Route

Use your nüvi to create and save routes before your next trip. You can save up to 10 routes.

- 1. touch Where to (or Tools) > routes > new.
- 2. touch add new start Point .
- 3. Find a location as your starting point, and touch **select**.
- 4. touch add new end Point .
- 5. Find a location as your ending point, and touch **select**.

- to uch to add another location to your route. touch to remove a location.
- 7. touch **next** to calculate your route and view it on the map.
- 8. touch **save** to save the route and exit.

Editing Routes

- 1. touch Where to (or Tools) > routes .
- 2. Select the route you want to edit.
- 3. touch edit.
- 4. touch an option to edit the route:
 - touch change name . enter a new name, and touch done.
 - touch add/remove Points to add new start, via, or end points to the route.
 - touch Manually reorder Points to change the order of points along your route.
 - touch optimally reorder
 Points to automatically order the points.

- touch **recalculate** to change the route preference to calculate by faster time, shorter distance, or off road.
- touch **delete** to remove this item.



noTe: Your changes are automatically saved when you exit any of the route edit pages.

finding a Place Using the Map

Use the Browse Map page to view different parts of the map. Touch **Where to** > **Browse Map**.

Tips for Browsing the Map

- Touch the map, and drag to view different parts of the map.
- Touch + and to zoom in and out.
- Touch any object on the map. An arrow appears pointing at the object.

- Touch **Save** to save this location.
- Touch **go** to navigate to the location.
- If the GPS mode is off, touch **Set Loc** to set your location to the selected location. (See page 37.)

entering coordinates

If you know the geographic coordinates of your destination, you can use your nüvi to navigate to any location using its latitude and longitude coordinates. This can be especially helpful when geocaching.

Touch Where to > Coordinates.

To change the type of coordinates, touch **Format**. Because different maps and charts use different position formats, the nüvi allows you to choose the correct coordinate format for the type of map you are using.

Enter the coordinates, and then touch **next**. Touch **go** to create a turn-by-turn

route to the coordinates.

searching **near another** location



noTe: Your nüvi automatically searches for places near your current location.

- 1. touch Where to > near.
- 2. Select an option:
 - Where i am now —search near your current location.
 - a different city —search near the city you enter.
 - My current route —search along your route.
 - My destination—search near your current destination.
- 3. touch \mathbf{ok} .

navigating off road

If you are not following roadways as you navigate, use Off Road mode. Touch **Tools** > **Settings** > **navigation** > **route Preference** > **off road** > **oK**. Select a destination and touch **go** to navigate off road to the destination.


Walking to a destination

If you are walking to your destination, use Pedestrian mode to optimize your route for walking. Touch Tools > Settings > System > Usage Mode > Pedestrian > oK .

Using The Main PaGes

Map Page

Touch **We wap** to open the Map page. The **B** vehicle icon shows your current location. Touch and drag the map to view a different area of the map (see page 13).





TiP: A speed limit icon **55** may appear as you travel on major roadways. This icon displays the current speed limit of the roadway.

Trip information Page

The Trip Information page displays your current speed and provides helpful statistics about your trip. To view the Trip Information page, touch the **Speed** or **arrival** field on the Map page.

If you make frequent stops, leave the nüvi turned on so it can accurately measure elapsed time during the trip.

Resetting Trip Information

If you want accurate trip information, reset the trip information before beginning a trip. Touch **reset Trip** to reset the information on the Trip Information page. Touch **reset Max** to reset the maximum speed.

Turn list Page

When you are navigating a route, the Turn List page displays turn-by-turn instructions for your entire route and the distance between turns. Touch the green text bar on the top of the Map page to open the Turn List page. Touch a turn on the list to view the Next Turn page for that turn. Touch **Show Map** to view the entire route on the Browse Map.

next Turn Page

When you are navigating a route, the Next Turn page shows the turn on the map and the distance and time left before you reach the turn. To view an upcoming turn on the map, touch the **Turn in** field on the Map page, or touch any turn from the Turn List page.

UsinG hands -free CallinG

Bluetooth is available only in the nüvi 710, 760, and 770. Using Bluetooth wireless technology, your nüvi can connect to your mobile phone to become a hands-free device. To see if your device with Bluetooth technology is compatible with the nüvi, visit www.garmin.com/bluetooth.

Bluetooth wireless technology establishes a wireless link between devices, such as a mobile phone and the nüvi. The first time you use two devices together you must "pair" them by establishing a relationship using a PIN/ passkey. After the initial pairing, the two devices can connect automatically each time you turn them on.



noTe: You might have to set your device to connect to the nüvi automatically when it is turned on.

Pairing your Phone

To pair and connect, your phone and the nüvi must be turned on and be within 10 meters of each other.

Initiate pairing from your nüvi or from your mobile phone. Refer to your phone's instructions.

To pair using the phone settings:

- Enable the phone's Bluetooth component. This might be in a menu called Settings, Bluetooth, Connections, or Hands-free.
- 2. Initiate a search for Bluetooth devices.
- 3. Select the nüvi from the list of devices.
- 4. Enter the nüvi's Bluetooth PIN (1234) into your phone.

To pair using the nüvi settings:

- 1. From the Menu page, touch **Tools** > settings > bluetooth > add.
- 2. Enable your phone's Bluetooth component and enable Find Me/ Discoverable/Visible mode. These settings might be in a Bluetooth, Connections, or Hands-free menu.
- 3. touch ok on the nüvi.
- 4. Select your phone, and touch ${\rm ok}$.
- 5. Enter the nüvi's Bluetooth PIN (1234) in your phone.

When your phone is connected to your nüvi, you are ready to make phone calls. Touch **Phone** to access the Phone menu.

When you turn on the nüvi, it tries to connect to the last phone to which it was connected.



noTe: Not all phones support all features of the nüvi Phone Menu.

receiving a call

When you get a call, the Incoming Call window opens.

Touch **answer** to answer the call. Touch **ignore** to ignore the call and stop the phone from ringing.

The internal microphone is in the front of the nüvi; speak normally.

in a call

During a call, the \bigcirc in Call icon appears. Touch \bigcirc > end Call to hang up. Touch \bigcirc > Call options for the following options:

- **Touch Tones**—displays a keypad page so you can use automated systems, such as voice mail.
- **Transfer audio To Phone** —this is helpful if you want to turn off the nüvi, but stay on the call or if you need privacy. To switch back, touch **Transfer audio To Device**.
- Mute Microphone.

Using Call Waiting

When you are on a call and you receive a second call (call waiting), the nüvi displays the Incoming Call window. Touch **answer** to answer the call. The first call is placed on hold.

To switch between calls:

- 1. touch 🕜 > switch To.
- 2. touch **end call** to hang up; this does not disconnect the call on hold.

Phone Menu

From the Menu page, touch **Phone** to open the Phone menu. Press **Status** to view the connected phone's signal strength, battery level, and name.



noTe: Not all phones support all features of the nüvi Phone Menu.

Using Your Phone Book

Each time your mobile phone connects with the nüvi, the phone book is automatically loaded into the nüvi. It may take a few minutes for the phone book to be available.

- 1. touch **Phone > Phone book**.
- 2. Touch the phone book entry (contact) you want to call.
- touch dial to call the contact, or touch compose to send an SMS/text message.

Dialing a Point of Interest

- 1. touch Phone > Points of interest.
- 2. Search for the point of interest you want to call.
- 3. touch dial or C.

Dialing a Number

- 1. touch Phone > dial.
- 2. Enter the number, and touch dial.

Viewing Your Call History

Each time your phone connects to the nüvi, your call history is automatically transferred to the nüvi. It may take a few minutes to transfer this data to the nüvi.

- 1. touch Phone > call history .
- 2. Touch a category to view those calls. the calls are listed in chronological order; the most recent calls are at the top of the list.
- 3. Touch an entry, and touch dial.

Calling Home

Enter a phone number for your home location, so you can quickly call home.

To enter your phone number:

- 1. touch Phone > call home .
- touch enter Phone number to use the keypad page or select from Phonebook (only available if your phone supports phone book transfer).

3. touch **done** > **yes**. the nüvi dials your home phone number.



noTe: To edit home location or phone number, touch **Where to** > **Favorites** > **Home** > **edit** .

To call home:

- 1. touch Phone > call home .
- 2. the nüvi dials your home phone number.

Placing Calls Using Voice Dial

You can place calls by speaking the contact's name.

- 1. touch Phone > Voice dial.
- 2. Speak the contact name.



noTe: You may need to "train" your mobile phone to recognize your voice dial commands. Refer to your phone's instructions.

sMs/Text Messaging

If your phone supports SMS/text messaging using Bluetooth technology, you can send and receive text messages on the nüvi.

Getting a Text Message

When you get a text message, the Incoming Message window opens. Touch **Listen** to play the text message, **review** to open your inbox, or **ignore** to close the window.

Sending a Text Message

- 1. touch Phone > Text Message > compose.
- 2. Select an option to select the text message recipient.
- 3. Enter the message, and touch **done**.



noTe: Messages sent from your nüvi do not appear in your phone's outbox.

Viewing Your Messages

- 1. touch Phone > Text Message.
- 2. touch inbox, outbox, or drafts.
- 3. Touch a message.
- 4. Select an option.
 - touch isten to listen to the message. (Must have a TTS voice selected to listen to SMS/ text messages; see page 39. Not available on 710 models.)
 - touch forward to send this message to another recipient or reply to reply to this contact.

UsinG The Media Players

Playing Music

Load music files to the internal memory or SD card. See pages 25–26.

- 1. touch Tools > Media Player.
- 2. touch **source** to open the music player.
- 3. touch browse.
- 4. Touch a category.
- To play the entire category from the beginning of the list, touch **Play all**. To play a specific song, touch the title.



- Touch the playlist to edit it.
- Touch 🐠 to adjust the volume.

- Tap (to play the previous song on the playlist; touch and hold to rewind through the current song.
- Tap b to skip to the next song; touch and hold to skip ahead through the current song.
- Touch (1) to pause the song.
- Touch 🗩 to repeat.
- Touch the album art to view details about the music file or to remove the song from the playlist.

Supported File Types

The nüvi supports MP3 music files, and M3U and M3U8 playlist files.

Creating and Listening to Playlists

Using your nüvi, you can listen to playlists created on your computer. You can also save playlists using your nüvi.

To save your current playlist:

- While listening to music, touch browse > Playlist > save current Playlist.
- 2. Enter a name, and touch done.

To create a new playlist:

- 1. In the music player, touch browse > Playlist > create new Playlist .
- 2. Select songs.
- touch back when you have finished adding songs to your playlist.

To create a playlist on a computer:

 Using your computer and an audio program, create a playlist of music files. Save the playlist as an M3U or M3U8 file.



noTe: You may need to edit the M3U file with a text editor, such as Notepad, to remove the path (link) to the music file. The M3U file should only list the music file names. Refer to the audio

program's Help file.

 Transfer the playlist and the music files to the nüvi or SD drive (see pages 25–26). The M3U file must be in the same location as the music files.

To play a playlist:

- In the music player, touch browse
 Playlist > open saved Playlist . All available playlists appear.
- 2. Touch a playlist to start playing the music files.

To edit a playlist:

- While listening to music, touch the playlist on the music player page, or touch browse > Playlist > edit current Playlist.
- 2. edit the playlist:
 - touch **add** to add a song to the end of the playlist.
 - Touch a song, and then touch **remove** to remove it from the playlist.

listening to audible books

To purchase books from Audible.com, go to http://garmin.audible.com.

Listening to a Book

- 1. touch Tools > Media Player.
- 2. touch **source** to open the audible book player.
- 3. touch browse.
- 4. Touch a category, and then touch a book title.



- Touch 🕑 to adjust the volume.
- Touch by to skip a section and
 to jump back. Press and hold to move forward or backward.
- Touch (1) to pause the book.

• Touch the book cover art to view more detailed information.

Using Bookmarks

To create a bookmark, touch **n** and **Bookmark**. To view your bookmarks, touch **n**, and then touch a bookmark. Touch **Play** to listen to the book from the bookmark.

Loading Audible Books

- 1. Create an Audible.com account at http://garmin.audible.com.
- 2. Download AudibleManager®.
- Open AudibleManager. Follow the on-screen instructions to activate your nüvi (one-time process).
- 4. Purchase a book at http://garmin .audible.com, and download the book to your computer.
- 5. Use AudibleManager to transfer the book to your nüvi or SD card.



TiP: Refer to AudibleManager's Help file for detailed instructions. Select **Help** > **Help**.

ManaGinG f iles

You can store files, such as MP3s and JPEG image files, in the nüvi's internal memory or on an optional SD card.



noTe: The nüvi is not compatible with Windows[®] 95, 98, Me, or NT. It is also not compatible with Mac[®] OS 10.3 and earlier. This is a common limitation of most USB mass storage devices.

loading files Step 1: Insert an SD Card (Optional)

To insert or remove the card, press it in until it clicks.

Step 2: Connect the USB Cable

Connect the mini-USB connector to the bottom of the nüvi. Connect the larger end of the cable to an available USB port on your computer.

Your nüvi and SD card appear as removable drives in My Computer on Windows computers and as mounted volumes on Mac computers.



noTe: On some operating systems or computers with multiple network drives, the nüvi drives may not appear. See your operating system's Help file to learn how to map the drives.

Step 3: Transfer Files to Your nüvi

Copy and paste files from your computer into the nüvi drives/volumes.

- 1. Browse your computer for the file you want to copy.
- Highlight the file, and select edit > copy.
- 3. Open the "Garmin" or SD card drive/volume.
- Select edit > Paste. The file appears in the list of files on the nüvi memory or SD card.

Step 4: Eject and Unplug the USB Cable

When you are finished transferring files, click the **eject** sicon in your system tray, or drag the volume icon to the **Trash** so Mac computers. Unplug your nüvi from your computer.

deleting files

With the nüvi connected to your computer, open nüvi or SD card drive/ volume. Highlight the file that you want to delete, and press the **Delete** key on your computer's keyboard.



CaUTion: If you are not sure about a file's purpose, do **noT** delete it. Your nüvi memory contains important system files that should **noT** be deleted. Be especially cautious of files located in folders entitled "Garmin."

UsinG The Tools

The Tools menu provides many features that are helpful when you are traveling across town or across the globe.

settings

For information about the settings, see pages 37–43.

Where am i

Touch **Where am i** to view information about your current location. This is a helpful feature if you need to tell emergency personnel your location. Touch a button on the right to view the nearest locations in that category. Touch **Save Location** to save your current location.

help

Touch **Help** to get information about using your nüvi.

Media Player

For information about the media player see pages 22–24.

Picture Viewer

Using the Picture Viewer, view pictures that you have stored in your nüvi.

- 1. touch Tools > Picture Viewer.
- 2. Touch a picture to view a larger image of it.
- 3. touch the arrows to view all the images.

Viewing a Slide Show

Touch **Slide Show** to start a slide show, which displays each image for a few moments and then displays the next image.

Touch anywhere on the screen to stop the slide show.

Traffic

You can only access the traffic information if the nüvi is connected to an FM traffic receiver. The traffic receiver is included in some nüvi 710, 750T, 760, and 770 packages. See pages 32–34 for information about traffic information.

Msn[®] direct

The traffic receiver is included in some nüvi 710, 750T, 760, and 770 packages.

Use an FM TMC (Traffic Message Channel) traffic receiver to receive traffic information broadcast over the FM Radio Data System. For information about FM traffic receivers and coverage areas, see www.garmin.com/traffic.



noTe: Garmin is not responsible for the accuracy of the traffic information. The FM traffic receiver simply receives signals from the traffic service provider and shows that information on your nüvi.



noTe: The FM traffic receiver and nüvi must be in data range of an FM station transmitting TMC data to receive traffic information.



noTe: You can only access the traffic information if the nüvi is connected to an FM traffic receiver.





noTe: If your FM TMC traffic receiver has an antenna with suction cups on it, route the antenna on your windshield vertically using the suction cups.

led blink codes

The green Power LED lights when connected to external power. The Status LED indicates the signal reception:

• Yellow dot-dash flashes: determining which country you are currently in.

- Yellow solid: searching for signal.
- Red solid: momentary sync loss.
- Green solid: normal traffic data.

Traffic in your area

Touch **Tools** > **Traffic** to display traffic incidents in your area. Touch **View by road** to see the incidents on each road in the area. If there is traffic on your route, touch **on My route** to view details.

Traffic on Your Road

When you are not navigating a route and there is traffic on your road, the Map page displays a traffic icon, such as or $\underline{\textcircled{}}$. Touch the icon to view information about the traffic delay.



Traffic on Your Route

When calculating your route, the nüvi examines the current traffic and automatically optimizes the route for the shortest time. You might still be routed through traffic if no alternative roads exist. If a severe traffic delay occurs on your route while you are navigating, the nüvi automatically recalculates the route.

The Map page displays or when there is traffic on your route. The number in the icon represents the number of minutes the traffic has added to your route, which has been automatically calculated into the arrival time shown on the map.

To avoid traffic on your route:

- 1. On the Map page, touch (1) or
- 2. touch to view traffic delays.
- 3. touch avoid.

If an FM transmitter is available on your nüvi, you can listen to your nüvi audio on an FM stereo.



noTe: When using the FM transmitter function on the nüvi, any phone calls that you place or receive through the nüvi might be overheard by adjacent vehicles through the FM stereo.

Manually Tuning the fM Transmitter

If you are not using an FM traffic receiver or you are using an MSN Direct receiver, select an FM channel for the FM transmitter.

- From the Menu page, touch Volume > fM Trans > enable fM Transmitter.
- tune your stereo to an fM channel that has a lot of static and has a low FM frequency number.
- touch and + to select the same frequency to which your stereo is tuned.

auto Tuning the fM Transmitter

If you are using an FM traffic receiver, the nüvi can select a channel for you.

- From the Menu page, touch Volume > fM Trans > enable fM Transmitter.
- 2. If you are using a traffic receiver, touch **auto Tune**. then tune your stereo to the selected channel.

frequency selection Tips For best results, select a frequency below

90.1 FM.

When searching for an appropriate FM frequency on your FM stereo, look for an unused frequency that has steady, consistent static. If you hear slight noises and sounds in the background of the static, choose a different frequency.

As you travel, you might need to change the frequency for the FM transmitter. A frequency not used by a radio station in your area might be used by a station elsewhere.

fM Transmitter information

The FM transmitter is intended to transmit your nüvi's audio to your FM stereo.

Do not adjust your FM settings while you are driving your vehicle.

The distance between the vehicle power cable, the nüvi, and the FM stereo antenna may also affect the noise level. Vehicles with antennas located far away, such as a rear-mounted antenna, may experience more interference from outside noise sources than vehicles with front-mounted antennas.

As you drive, you may notice changes in the background static even though there is no FM station using that channel. You may notice this as you drive through intersections where certain kinds of traffic lights or other municipal electronic systems are operating. You might also notice this effect when the terrain changes, allowing distant stations to be received by your car stereo that were not received when you made your initial frequency selection. These and other sources of electrical interference may make it necessary to look for another frequency.

Brightness—adjust the backlight brightness level. Reducing the backlight brightness increases your battery life.

Updating the Time settings

Time Format—choose a 12-hour, 24-hour, or UTC time format.

Time Zone—select a time zone or nearby city from the list.

Daylight Saving—set to **on**, **off**, or **auto**, if it is available.

restore —restore the original time settings.

setting the languages

Touch Tools > Settings > Language.

Voice—change the language for voice prompts.

nüvi 750, 750T, 760, and 770: Languages noted with a person's name are text-to-speech (TTS) voices, which have an extensive vocabulary and pronounce the street names as you approach turns. The pre-recorded voices (those without a person's name) have a limited vocabulary and do not speak names of locations or streets.

Text Language—change all on-screen text to the selected language. Changing the text language does not change the language of user-entered data or map data, such as street names.

Keyboard—select the keyboard for your language. You can also change the keyboard language mode from any keyboard by touching the **Mode** button.

Safe Mode—turn on or off Safe mode. When your vehicle is moving, Safe mode disables all functions that require significant operator attention and could become a distraction while driving.

restore —restore the original security settings. Note that restoring the security settings will not clear your Garmin Lock PIN or Security Location.

Connections—select **add** > **oK** to pair with a mobile phone that has Bluetooth wireless technology. See pages 17–21. Select **Change** to connect with a different device.



noTe: The nüvi's PIN code (or passkey) is **1234**.

Drop—select the phone you want to disconnect, and touch **Yes**.

remove —select the phone you want to delete from the nüvi's memory, and touch **Yes**.

Bluetooth—enable and disable the Bluetooth component. The Bluetooth icon appears on the Menu page if the Bluetooth component is enabled. To prevent a phone from automatically connecting, select **Disabled**.

Friendly name—enter a friendly name that identifies your nüvi on devices with Bluetooth technology. Touch **Done**.

Troubleshoot—scroll through the list containing compatible devices. If your phone is not in this list, go to www.garmin.com/bluetooth for more information.

restore —restore the original Bluetooth settings. This does not clear the pairing information.

changing the Proximity Points settings

You must have proximity points (such as custom POIs, a safety camera database, or a TourGuide[®]) loaded to adjust the proximity point settings. See page 47. Touch **Tools** > **Settings** > **Proximity Points**.

Proximity alerts —touch **Change** to turn on or off the alerts when you approach custom POIs or safety cameras.

Tourguide —set how you want the audio for TourGuide to be activated. Select **auto Play** to hear the complete tour as programmed, **Prompted** to show the speaker icon **Solution** on the map when tour information is available during your route, or **off**.

restore —restore the proximity points settings.

To adjust the volume levels for the media player and navigation prompts, **Tools** > **Settings** > **Volume**.

clearing User data



CaUTion: This deletes all userentered information.

calibrating the screen

If the touch screen is not responding properly, calibrate the touch screen. Turn the nüvi off and then back on. Slide the **Power** key to the right (lock). Hold your finger on the screen for about 30 seconds until the calibration screen appears. Follow the on-screen instructions.

resetting the nüvi

If the nüvi screen stops functioning, turn the nüvi off and on again. If this does not help, slide the **Power** key to the left and hold for 8 seconds. Turn the nüvi back on. The nüvi should operate normally.

locking your nüvi

Garmin Lock^m is a theft-deterrent system that locks your nüvi. Each time you turn on the nüvi, enter the PIN or drive to the security location.

- 1. touch Tools > settings > security.
- 2. Touch the button below **Garmin** lock .
- 3. Enter a 4-digit PIN and drive to a security location.

What is a Security Location?

Select a location you return to often, such as your home, for your security location. If the nüvi has satellite signals and you are at the security location, you do not need to enter the PIN.



noTe: If you forget your PIN and your security location, you must send your nüvi to Garmin to get it unlocked. You must also send a valid product registration or proof of purchase.

additional Maps

You can purchase additional MapSource map data from Garmin and load the maps on your nüvi's internal memory or on an optional SD card. Also, check www.garmin.com/unlock/update.jsp to see if an update for your map software is available.

To find out the version of the maps that are loaded on your nüvi, open the Menu page. Touch **Tools** > **Settings** > **Map** > **Map info**. To enable additional maps, you need your unit ID (see page 37) and serial number (located near the power connector).

To load maps, routes, or waypoints to your nüvi memory or SD card, select the name for your nüvi drive or SD card drive. Refer to the MapSource Help file for more information.

Updating the software

- Go to www.garmin.com/products/ webupdater and download WebUpdater to your computer.
- 2. connect the nüvi to your computer using the mini-USB cable.
- 3. Run WebUpdater, and follow the on-screen instructions.

After confirming that you want to perform an update, WebUpdater automatically downloads the update and installs it on your nüvi.

To use the SaversGuide, insert the SD card into your nüvi. Touch **Where to** > **extras** > **Saversguide**.

Safety Cameras

Safety camera information is available in some locations. Check http://my.garmin .com for availability. For these locations, the nüvi includes the locations of hundreds of safety cameras. Your nüvi alerts you when you are approaching a safety camera and can warn you if you are driving too fast. The data is updated at least weekly, so you always have access to the most up-to-date information.

You can purchase a new region or extend an existing subscription at any time. Each region that you purchase has its own expiration date.

Custom Points of Interest

Use the POI Loader to load custom points of interest (POIs) onto your nüvi. POI databases are available from various companies on the Internet. Some custom databases contain alert information for points, such as safety cameras and school zones.

Go to www.garmin.com/extras, and click **Poi Loader** to install the POI Loader onto your computer. For more information, refer to the POI Loader Help file; press **F1** to open the Help file.

To view your Custom POIs, touch Where to > extras > Custom Pois . To change the proximity alert settings, touch Tools > Settings > Proximity Points > Proximity alerts .

To delete the Custom POIs from your nüvi, connect your nüvi to your computer. Open the **garmin\poi** folder in the nüvi drive or the SD card drive. Delete the file entitled **poi.gpi**.

TourGuide

To view your TourGuide files, touch Where to > extras > Custom Pois . To change the TourGuide settings, touch Tools > Settings > Proximity Points > Tourguide .

battery information

Your nüvi contains an internal, nonreplaceable, lithium-ion battery. Do not remove or attempt to remove the battery. Doing so could result in risk of battery fire or damage and injury.

The battery icon in the corner of the Menu page indicates the status of the internal battery. To increase the accuracy of the battery gauge, fully discharge the battery and then fully charge it; do not unplug the nüvi until it is totally charged.

Contact your local waste disposal department for information on properly disposing of the unit.

Maximizing the Battery Life

- Turn down the backlight (Tools > Settings > Display > Brightness).
- Do not leave your nüvi in direct sunlight. Avoid prolonged exposure to excessive heat.

changing the fuse



CaUTion: When replacing the fuse, do not lose any of the small pieces and make sure they are put back in the proper place.

If your unit will not charge in your vehicle, you may need to replace the fuse located at the tip of the vehicle adapter.

- 1. Unscrew the black, round end piece, and remove it.
- 2. Remove the fuse (glass and silver cylinder), and replace with a 3A fast blow fuse.
- ensure that the silver tip is placed in the black end piece. Screw on the black end piece.



removing the nüvi and Mount

To remove the nüvi from the cradle, press the button on the bottom of the cradle up, and tilt the nüvi forward.

To remove the cradle from the mount, turn the cradle to the right or left. Apply pressure in that direction until the cradle snaps off the mount.

To remove the suction cup mount from the windshield, flip the lever toward you. Pull the tab on the suction cup toward you.

Mounting on your dashboard

Use the enclosed mounting disk to mount your unit to the dashboard and comply with certain state regulations.



CaUTion: The **permanent** mounting adhesive is extremely difficult to remove after it is installed.

- 1. Clean and dry the dashboard where you are placing the disk.
- 2. Remove the backing from the adhesive on the bottom of the disk.
- 3. Place the disk on the dashboard.
- 4. Remove the clear plastic cover from the top of the disk.
- 5. Place the suction cup mount on top of the disk. Flip the lever down (toward the disk).

about GPs satellite signals

Your nüvi must acquire GPS (Global Positioning System) satellite signals to navigate. If you are indoors, near tall buildings or trees, or in a parking garage, your nüvi cannot acquire satellites. Go outside to an area free from tall obstructions to use your nüvi.

When your nüvi has acquired satellite signals, the signal strength bars on the Menu page are green **DOM**. When it loses satellite signals, the bars turn red or clear $\Box\Box\Box\Box$.

caring for your nüvi

Your nüvi contains sensitive electronic components that can be permanently damaged if exposed to excessive shock or vibration. To minimize the risk of damage to your nüvi, avoid dropping your unit and operating it in high-shock and high-vibration environments.

Cleaning the Unit

The nüvi is constructed of high-quality materials and does not require user maintenance other than cleaning. Clean the unit's outer casing (not the touch screen) using a cloth dampened with a mild detergent solution, and then wipe dry. Avoid chemical cleaners and solvents that can damage plastic components.

Cleaning the Touch Screen

Clean the touch screen with a soft, clean, lint-free cloth. Use water, isopropyl alcohol, or eyeglass cleaner, if needed. Apply the liquid to the cloth, and then gently wipe the touch screen.

Protecting Your nüvi

- Do not store the nüvi where prolonged exposure to extreme temperatures can occur, because it can cause permanent damage.
- Do not expose the nüvi to water. Contact with water can cause this unit to malfunction.
- Though a PDA stylus can be used to operate the touch screen, never attempt this while operating a vehicle. Never use a hard or sharp object to operate the touch screen, or damage may result.

Avoiding Theft

- To avoid theft, remove the unit and mount from sight when not in use. Remove the residue on the windshield left by the suction cup.
- Do not keep your unit in the glove compartment.
- Register your product at http://my.garmin.com.
- Use the Garmin Lock feature. See page 44.
