Setting the language, date/time



Language:

▲/▼ to change. OK to accept.

Date/Time:

At the prompt, press OK.

↓/▼ to change current field.
↓/▶ for previous/next field.

NOTE: To change language or date/time in the future, use the Setup menu (see page 37).

Storing pictures on an (accessory) SD or SDHC Card

Your camera has internal memory. You can purchase an SD or SDHC Card to store more pictures and videos. (Maximum supported card size is 32 GB.)

CAUTION:

A card can only be inserted one way; forcing it may cause damage. Inserting or removing a card when the camera is on may damage the pictures, the card, or the camera.

- Turn off the camera.
- Insert or remove the optional card.
- Turn on the camera.





Taking pictures/videos

Taking a picture



- 1 Turn the Mode dial to Smart Capture
 - Press the Shutter button halfway to lock on the subject.
 When the framing marks turn green, press the Shutter button completely down.

NOTE: For more information on Smart Capture and other modes, see page 6. Framing marks do not appear in some SCN (scene) and Video modes.

Using the framing marks

Framing marks




Framing marks indicate the camera focus area.

- **1** Press the Shutter button **halfway**.

 If the camera is not focusing on the desired subject, release the Shutter button and recompose the scene.
- **2** Press the Shutter button **completely down** to take the picture.

NOTE: Framing marks do not appear in all modes. Multiple framing marks may appear when faces are detected.

Taking a video



- 1 Turn the Mode dial to Video ...
- Press the Shutter button completely down and release. (To stop recording, press and release again.)

Reviewing the picture/video just taken

After you take a picture/video, the LCD displays a quickview for several seconds. (To dismiss the quickview sooner, press the Shutter button halfway.) The picture/video is saved unless you press the Delete abutton.

- **2** Press **4/ a** to highlight Scene modes.



Using optical zoom

Use optical zoom to get up to 10X closer to your subject while taking pictures/videos.



Optical zoom Digital zoom

- 1 Use the LCD to frame your subject. For focus distances, see Camera specifications, page 53.
- 2 Press Telephoto (T) to zoom in. Press Wide Angle (W) to zoom out.
- **3** Take the picture or video.

NOTE: To get a focused picture every time, remember:

- Use the framing marks, page 4.
- As you zoom in, move away from your subject.

Use digital zoom to get up to 5X beyond optical zoom while taking pictures. Turn digital zoom on/off using the Setup menu (see page 35). Digital zoom is not available in Smart Capture mode.

NOTE: You may notice decreased image quality when using digital zoom. The slider on the LCD turns red when the picture quality reaches the limit for an acceptable 4 x 6-in. (10 x 15 cm) print.

Using the flash

Use the flash when you take pictures at night, indoors, or outdoors in heavy shadows. Flash settings are limited in some capture modes.



Press the Flash button repeatedly to scroll through flash modes The current flash mode is shown on the LCD.

Using the Focus button

- Press the Focus button repeatedly to scroll through focus modes.

The current Focus mode is shown on the LCD.

1 In most Still modes, press the Focus button until the desired focus icon is displayed on the LCD:

Mode	lcon	For
Auto Focus (AF)	No icon.	Normal picture taking.
Infinity		Distant scenery, or for taking pictures through a window.
Macro	*	Subjects that are 12–60 cm (4.7–23.6 in.) from the lens.

2 Press the Shutter button **halfway** to focus and set exposure, then **completely down** to take the picture.

Using the self-timer

Use the self-timer when you want to be included in a picture, or to ensure a steady Shutter button press. Place the camera on a tripod or flat surface.

- 1 Repeatedly press the Self-timer/Burst 🐧 button to choose a setting:
 - **10 seconds**—A picture is taken after a 10-second delay (so you have time to get into the scene).
 - **2 seconds**—A picture is taken after a 2-second delay (for a steady, shutter release on a tripod).
 - **2 shot**—The first picture is taken after a 10-second delay. A second picture is taken 8 seconds later.
- **2** Compose the scene. Press the Shutter button **halfway**, then **completely down**. The camera takes the picture/pictures after the delay.

Use the same procedure to take a 2- or 10-second self-timer video, but press the Shutter button **completely down**.

Using burst

Use the Burst feature to take up to 3 pictures in quick succession.

NOTE: Burst is unavailable in Portrait, Night Portrait, Night Landscape, Backlight, Fireworks, and Panorama modes

- 1 Repeatedly press the Self-timer/Burst button 🐧 until the Burst 🚮 icon appears on the LCD.
- **2** Press the Shutter button **halfway** to focus and set exposure.
- **3** Press the Shutter button **completely down and hold it** to take pictures. *The camera takes up to 3 pictures while the Shutter button is pressed.*

NOTE: During quickview, you can delete all pictures in the burst series. To delete selectively, do so in Review (see page 19).

Taking panoramic pictures

Use panorama to "stitch" up to 3 pictures into a panoramic scene.

NOTE: For best results, use a tripod. Individual pictures are not saved, even if panorama capture is cancelled before stitching occurs. (Exposure Compensation, White Balance, Exposure Metering, AF Zone, AF Control, Color Mode, and Sharpness are set with the first picture. The flash is set to Off.) You can use the self-timer (2- and 10-second delays) while taking panoramic pictures. See page 11.

- **1** Turn the Mode dial to Panorama **【**□**▶**.
- 2 Press / to highlight Panorama Left-Right or Panorama Right-Left (depending on the direction you want to pan), then press OK.
- **3** Take the first picture.

 After a quickview, the LCD displays the liveview and an "overlay" from the first picture.
- **4** Compose the second picture. Make the overlay from the first picture cover the same portion in the new picture.
- **5** If you are taking only 2 pictures, press OK to stitch them together. *After you take 3 pictures, the pictures are automatically stitched together.*

Getting help from your camera


You want the most from your camera. You want to understand:

- What it can do for you
- And how to take the best possible pictures and videos

Great news!

Your camera offers a built-in Help system. It describes every setting for every menu choice. If you learn nothing else about your camera, learn how to use on-camera Help. Because the more you know your camera, the more confident you become!

Turning on camera Help



P, A, S, and M modes

Use these modes when you want more control over your camera and pictures.


Mode	When to use	Press 4/> 4/~ to control
P	Program mode offers the ease of auto shooting with full access to all menu options. The camera automatically sets the shutter speed and aperture (f-stop) based on the scene lighting.	Exposure compensation (how much light enters the camera), flash compensation, and ISO speed
Α	Aperture Priority mode controls depth of field (the range of sharpness). The aperture setting may be affected by optical zoom.	Aperture, exposure compensation, flash compensation, and ISO speed
S	Shutter Priority mode prevents blur when your subject is moving. The camera automatically sets the aperture for proper exposure. (To prevent blur, use a tripod for slow shutter speeds.)	Shutter speed and flash compensation
M	Manual mode offers the highest level of creative control. (To prevent blur, use a tripod for slow shutter speeds.)	Aperture, shutter speed, flash compensation, and ISO speed

NOTE: Settings you change in P, A, S, or M modes apply only to pictures taken in those modes. The settings, including Flash, are maintained for P, A, S, and M modes—even when you change modes or turn off the camera. Use Reset Camera (see page 37) to reset P, A, S, or M mode to its default setting.

Changing P, A, S, or M mode settings

PASM modes control the aperture (f-number, also known as f-stop), shutter speed, exposure compensation, flash compensation, and ISO. Use the Menu button to control all other settings.

- 1 Turn the Mode dial to P, A, S, or M.
- **2** Press **1** to access a setting. Press **1** to change the setting.



ISO—adjust the camera's sensitivity to light. Higher ISO indicates greater sensitivity. NOTE: A higher ISO may produce unwanted "noise" in a picture.

Flash Compensation—adjust flash brightness.

Exposure Compensation—adjust the exposure. If the scene is too light, decrease the setting; if it's too dark, increase the setting.

Shutter speed—control how long the shutter stays open. (Use a tripod for slow shutter speeds.)

Aperture—(also known as f-stop) control the size of the lens opening, which determines the depth of field.

- Smaller f-stop numbers indicate a larger lens opening; good for low-light.
- Larger f-stop numbers indicate a smaller lens opening; keeps the main subject sharp; good for landscapes and well-lit conditions.

Using exposure compensation to adjust brightness

In P, A, S, and Panorama modes, you can adjust exposure compensation before you take a picture to make your pictures darker or lighter. Only the first picture in Panorama mode can be adjusted—that adjustment is applied to the remaining pictures.

- Press **1/** to access the exposure compensation setting.

An exposure compensation level is shown on the LCD and the image gets darker or lighter. Take the picture when you are satisfied with the exposure compensation level.

Using exposure compensation with exposure bracketing

In P and A modes, you can use exposure compensation in conjunction with exposure bracketing to get the best exposure.

If the exposure compensation is set to:	And if the exposure bracketing interval is set to 0.3 steps:	Then the exposures taken are:
0.0	Set the Exposure Bracketing Interval	-0.3, 0.0, +0.3

Using the histogram to view picture brightness

Use the histogram to evaluate the distribution of light before or after you take a picture. Optimal exposure is achieved when the peak is in the middle of the histogram. The flash may affect a picture's light and shadow.

To turn on the histogram in Capture mode or in Review, press the Info 1 button until the histogram appears.





Reviewing pictures/videos

Press the Review button to view and work with your pictures/videos. Press Review again to exit.



- **1** Press the Review button.
- 2 Press **//** for previous/next picture/video.
 - Press the Review button to return to Capture mode.
 - To view pictures/videos as thumbnails, see page 30.


Magnifying a picture during review



- **1** Press + to magnify 1X–8X.
- 2 Press / to view other parts of a picture.
 - Press OK to return to 1X.

Playing a video





- **1** Press the Review button.
- 2 Press **//** to locate previous/next video.
- **3** Press OK to play a video.
 - Press / during playback to adjust the volume
 - Press OK to pause/resume.(Press **//** during pause to go to previous/next frame.
 - Press during playback to play at 2X speed; press again for 4X. Press / during 4X to jump to a bookmark. (See page 26.)
 - Press during playback to reverse at 2X speed; press again for 4X.

Deleting pictures/videos

- **1** Press the Review button.
- **2** Press **//** to find a picture/video.
- **3** Press the Delete **#** button.
- **4** Follow the screen prompts.

Using the undo delete feature

If you accidentally delete a picture/video, you may be able to use Undo Delete to retrieve it. This feature is only available immediately after you delete a single picture/video while in Review (not during a Quickview).

Protecting pictures/videos from deletion

- 1 Press the Review button, then 1 to find a picture.
- 2 Press the Menu 📰 button.
- 3 Press to highlight Protect, then press OK.

 The Protect icon appears with the protected picture/video.
 - Press the Menu button to exit the menu.



Formatting internal memory or an SD or SDHC Card deletes all (including protected) pictures/videos. (Formatting internal memory also deletes email addresses, tag names, and favorites.)

IMPORTANT: Your camera offers a built-in Help system. See page 13.

Using shortcuts

For quick access to the most popular functions:

- 1 Press the Info button.

 The shortcuts appear.
- 2 Press **//** to access functions like Select Picture, Add Text Tag, and View Multi-up.
- **3** Press —/ to choose a setting.

To hide the shortcuts again, press **1**.



Using the menu button in Review

- 1 Press the Review button, then the Menu button.
- **2** Press **4/** to choose a tab:
 - **Review** to view pictures/videos
 - **Edit** to edit pictures/videos
 - **Setup** for other camera settings

NOTE: You may need to scroll up to highlight the current tab before you can choose another tab.

- **3** Press to highlight a setting, then press OK.
- 4 Choose an option, then press OK.

IMPORTANT: Your camera offers a built-in Help system. See page 13.

Adding sound tags

You can record a voice or sound (up to 1 minute long) to add to a picture.

NOTE: Only one sound tag can be added to each picture (not to videos).

Recording a sound tag

- 1 Press the Review button, then 1 to find a picture.
- 2 Press the Menu 📰 button, then 🌗 to highlight the Edit ኳ tab.
- **3** Press / to highlight Sound Tag, then press OK.
- **4** Follow the screen prompts.

The sound tag is applied to your picture.

Press the Menu button to exit the menu.

IMPORTANT: Your camera offers a built-in Help system. See page 13.


Playing a sound tag



- 1 Press the Review button, then \(\bigcup \) to find a picture with a "Play Sound Tag" prompt.
- **2** Press to play the sound tag.
- **3** Press **/** to adjust the volume.
 - Press OK to stop playback.

Cropping pictures

You can crop a picture so that only the desired portion of the picture remains. (You cannot crop these pictures: panoramic, 16:9, video action prints, pictures from a video, or pictures that are already cropped.)



- 1 Press the Review button, then \(\big| \) to find a picture.
- 2 Press the Menu **b** button, then **1** to highlight the Edit **t**ab.
- **3** Press __/_ to highlight Crop, then press OK.
- 4 Press the Zoom lever (T/W) to zoom in/out. Press 4/1 a/v to move the crop box. Then press OK.
- **5** Follow the screen prompts. The picture is cropped, the original saved. (Cropped pictures cannot be cropped again.)
 - Press the Menu button to exit the menu.

IMPORTANT: Your camera offers a built-in Help system. See page 13.

Using KODAK PERFECT TOUCH Technology

KODAK PERFECT TOUCH Technology helps ensure better, brighter pictures. PERFECT TOUCH Technology is automatically applied to pictures taken in Smart Capture mode. (You cannot enhance videos, panoramic pictures, or pictures that are already enhanced.)

- 1 Press the Review button, then 4/ to find a picture.
- 2 Press the Menu 📰 button, then 🎶 to highlight the Edit 🛱 tab.
- **3** Press to highlight Perfect Touch tech, then press OK.

 A preview is shown in a split screen. Press


 **To view other parts of the picture.
- **4** Press OK. Follow the screen prompts to replace the original picture or to save the enhanced picture as a new one.
- Press the Menu button to exit the menu.

Editing videos

Making a picture from a video

You can choose a single frame from a video, then make a picture suitable for printing.



- **1** Press the Review **▶** button, then ***/▶** to find a video.
- 2 Press the Menu button, then


 to highlight the Edit

 tab.
- **3** Press __/_ to highlight Make Picture, then press OK.
- 4 Press OK to play the video. (Press OK to pause). Press **//** to navigate through video frames.
- **5** During play or pause, press to make a picture.
 - A picture is created. (The original video is saved.)
 - Press the Menu button to exit the menu.

IMPORTANT: Your camera offers a built-in Help system. See page 13.

Trimming a video

You can delete an unwanted portion from the beginning or end of a video.



- 1 Press the Review button, then 1 to find a video.
- 2 Press the Menu button, then ***/>** to highlight the Edit **t** tab.
- **3** Press _____ to highlight Trim, then press OK.
- **4** Follow the screen prompts.


The video is trimmed. (You can save it as a new video or replace the original.)

■ Press the Menu button to exit the menu.

Using video bookmarks

You can set bookmarks at interesting places in your video, then jump from one bookmark to another.


Setting bookmarks



- 2 Press the Menu button, then to highlight the Edit tab. Highlight Bookmark, then press OK.
- 3 Press __/_ to highlight Create/Edit, then press OK.
- **4** While the video plays, press to add bookmarks. When finished adding up to 9 bookmarks, press .
 - Press the Menu button to exit the menu.

IMPORTANT: Your camera offers a built-in Help system. See page 13.


Using bookmarks



- 2 Press to play the video. To jump to the first bookmark, press and hold //> for 4 seconds while the video is playing.
 - After you jump to a bookmark, press ***/** to jump to other bookmarks.
 - To view all bookmarked video frames, press the Wide Angle (W) button. To return to normal view, press the Telephoto (T) button.

Making a video action print

From a video, you can make a 4-, 9-, or 16-up picture, suitable for a 4 x 6-inch (10 x 15 cm) print.



- 1 Press the Review button, then 1 to find a video.
- 2 Press the Menu button, then **1** to highlight the Edit **1** tab.
- **3** Press to highlight Action Print, then press OK. Choose an option, then press OK:
- Auto options: The camera includes the first and last frames, then 2, 7, or 14 equally spaced frames.
- Manual: You choose the first and last frames; the camera chooses 2, 7, or 14 equally spaced frames.
- Use Bookmarks: Bookmarked frames are used.

 A 4-, 9-, or 16-up picture is created. If you have less than 4 or 9 bookmarks, equally spaced video frames are used.
- Press the Menu button to exit the menu.

IMPORTANT: Your camera offers a built-in Help system. See page 13.

Play a multimedia slide show

To show all pictures/videos

- **1** Press the Review button.
- 2 Press the Menu button, then 1 to highlight the Review tab.
- **3** Press __/_ to highlight Multimedia Slide Show, then press OK.
- 4 Press _____ to highlight Preview Slide Show, then press OK.

 All pictures/videos are displayed. To interrupt the slide show, press OK. After the slide show plays, you may save or modify it.

IMPORTANT: Your camera offers a built-in Help system. See page 13.

To show selected pictures/videos

- **1** Press the Review button.
- 2 Press the Menu button, then 1 to highlight the Review tab.
- **3** Press __/_ to highlight Multimedia Slide Show, then press OK.
- 4 Press __/_ to highlight Select Images, then press OK.
- Fress to locate a picture/video, then press OK.
 A checkmark appears.
 - Press **1/** to continue adding pictures/videos. When finished, press **1/** to highlight Done, then press OK.
- **6** Press \(\int \) to highlight Preview Slide Show, then press OK. Selected pictures/videos are displayed. To interrupt the slide show, press OK. After the slide show plays, you may save or modify it.

Displaying pictures/videos on a television

You can display pictures/videos on a television, computer monitor, or any device equipped with a video input. To connect the camera to a television, use an A/V cable (may be sold separately).



NOTE: Ensure that the Video Out setting (NTSC or PAL) is correct (see page 37). (Image quality on a television screen may not be as good as on a computer monitor or when printed.)


Viewing pictures/videos in different ways

Viewing as thumbnails (multi-up)

- **1** Press the Review button.
- 2 Press the Wide Angle (W) button to change from single-picture view to multi-up thumbnails.
- **3** Press Telephoto (T) to return to single-picture view.
 - To select multiple pictures/videos, see page 30.
 - Press the Review button to exit Review.

Selecting multiple pictures/videos

Use the multi-select feature when you have two or more pictures/videos to print or delete. (Multi-select can also be used in Multi-Up mode, page 30.)



- 1 Press the Review button, then **1** to find a picture/video.
- **2** Press OK to select pictures/videos.

 A check mark appears on the picture. You can now print or delete the selected pictures. You can press OK a second time to remove a check mark.

Copying pictures/videos

You can copy pictures/videos from a card to internal memory or from internal memory to a card.

NOTE: Before you copy, make sure that a card is inserted in the camera.


Copy pictures/videos:

- 1 Press the Review button, then the Menu button.
- **2** Press **/** to highlight Copy, then press OK.
- **3** Press —/ to highlight an option, then press OK.

IMPORTANT: Your camera offers a built-in Help system. See page 13.

NOTE: Pictures/videos are copied, not moved. To remove pictures/videos from the original location after copying, delete them (see page 19).

4 Using the menu button

You can change settings to get the best results from your camera.

- **2** Press **1** to highlight a tab:
 - **Capture/Video** for the most common picture/video-taking settings
 - **Setup** for other camera settings
- **3** Press to highlight a setting, then press OK.
- 4 Highlight an option, then press OK. (Some options let you use 4/).)

NOTE: Some modes offer limited settings. Some settings remain until you change them; others, until you change modes or turn off the camera.
